FARMING INDUSTRY LONG SERVICE AWARDS

Each year the Society will award up to SIX CERTIFICATES kindly presented by THE DEPARTMENT OF ENVIRONMENT, FOOD AND AGRICULTURE to Farm Employees who have served, not necessarily on the same farm or with the same employer, for not less than 30 years. The service must have been continuous in the Isle of Man, except that a period of up to 4 years training at an Agricultural College or Technical Institute will not count as a break in service, nor will it count towards the 30 year period. Time of service to count: two days prior to the current Showday. Applications for certificates must be made by the Employer to the Secretary of the RMAS by 1st July.
